# "About Sinning"

# Three questions that need to be answered before we close up this series on Struggling with Sin:

- 1. What happens when I sin?
- 2. Is there a test for how I'm doing?
- 3. How do I proceed when I fail?

#### 1. What happens when I sin? - Colossians 3:25

- A. It's important to point out that even though sin can no longer kill the Christian, sin will have other consequences.
  - I. So, I want to fight it because God has called me to holiness.

"For God did not call us to be impure, but to live a holy life." - 1 Thessalonians 4:7

- B. What kind of consequences?
  - I. Was the sin willful or not?
    - a.) Willful disobedience to God is *proper-sin*.

"Therefore, to one who knows the right thing to do and does not do it, to him it is sin." - James 4:17

- b.) Doing something that's <u>against your faith (i.e., conscience</u>) is sin. (Romans 14:23)
- c.) There are greater consequences to the one who willfully sins. (Luke 12:47-48)
- II. God is compassionate and slow to anger. (Psalm 103:8-14)
- III. He will continue to discipline as needed until change (i.e., repentance) is secured.
  - a.) Change for our protection is the goal of Godly discipline, not punishment for revenge.
- C. Some Biblical Consequences for sin: (not exhaustive)
  - I. Loss of Peace (Outward)
    - a.) Conscience is worn.
    - b.) Emotional or Spiritual brokenness.
  - II. Loss of Peace (Outward)
    - a.) Broken relationships.
    - b.) Broken finances.
    - c.) Broken occupations.
    - d.) Broken health (physical).
  - III. Satanic Strongholds Ultimately (Ephesians 4:26-27).
    - a.) Remember King Saul's spiritual troubles?
  - IV. Distance from God.

Your iniquities have separated you from your God; your sins have hidden his face from you, so that he will not hear. - Isaiah 59:2

D. Our call to holiness and our fight against sin ought to be taken very seriously. (1 Peter 1:14-19)

Pursue...holiness without which no one will see the Lord. - Hebrews 12:14

- A. Remember Romans 8:1
- B. Confess a pray things like this:

"Lord, do not give me what I deserve. Have mercy on me."

"Take back the ground I've given to Satan in my life and in the life of those around me."

"Grant me Your power to defeat this sin permanently."

"Cleanse me and my whole life and forgive me for offending all those I've hurt through my sin (whether they know it or not)."
